Our association started in 2014 when, together with Freemasons from District 21, it was decided to arrange the collection of tins of soup and warm socks to keep the many homeless people on the Central Coast warm during the winter months. The 'Soxs and Soup' campaign was launched by [Shoebbox Revolution](#), a charity providing care packages for the homeless, based at The Entrance. This was a very successful initiative which continues to this day. During these past 10 years [FotCC](#) and [CCB](#) have carried out many fundraising events together and are always happy to help each other with community projects when needed.

On 24 April 2024, to mark the 10 Year Anniversary, the CC Bulldogs Club President was presented with a cheque for \$6,600 to purchase the Club's kit for the year. This takes the total amount donated to them to over \$45,000 since 2014. It may seem strange for us to provide a club – another charity – with apparel but FotCC rarely give cash; instead we purchase needed goods and services, while CCB provide financial assistance in the form of cash to many charities based on the Central Coast.

During the last few years the Club has raised much-needed funds for Central Coast Kids In Need ([CCKIN](#)) by donating money raised on their bus trips to games, conducting meat-tray raffles at Budgewoi Soccer Club, and by sponsoring a Race Day at Wyong Races, along with FotCC and other organisations. This year, already, CC Bulldogs have donated \$5,000 to CCKIN to assist children and families who require hospital care.
