A significant proportion of the money raised was due to a large number of generous donations, from the local community, of items that were auctioned off on the night or used as raffle prizes.

A segment on **Channel 9**'s **A Current Affair** hosted by Simon Bouda provided an insight into the outstanding work of CCKIN. The telecast resulted in a flood of monetary donations and offers of assistance which, along with the support of Freemasons on the Central Coast, will enable the work of the charity to continue well into 2021.

On the evening of Thursday 24 September, CCKIN representative, Mr Steve Sullivan, surprised members of Freemasons on the Central Coast with a plaque recognising their support and proclaiming that they are now **Community Ambassadors** for the charity.
